Stanley was born in Woollahra, NSW, on 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1893, the son of Gustavus and Evelyne Blumenthal.

On 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 he enlisted in G Company, AN&MEF, stating that he was a carter, single and gave his mother at "Kia Ora", Waratah Ave, Randwick, as his next of kin.

Stanley returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1915 having completed 206 days service.

On 4<sup>th</sup> April 1915 Stanley joined the 4<sup>th</sup> Machine Gun Squadron, 12<sup>th</sup> Light Horse and went to Suez aboard the SUEVIC, departing Sydney 13<sup>th</sup> June 1915. On 29<sup>th</sup> August 1915 he was absorbed into his unit on Gallipoli and on 3<sup>rd</sup> November he transferred to the 7<sup>th</sup> Light Horse.

After the evacuation, he transferred back to the 12<sup>th</sup> Light Horse. On 1<sup>st</sup> Jan 1918 he was promoted driver and sailed ex Egypt aboard the DONGOLA, arriving back in Australia on 28<sup>th</sup> August 1919. He was discharged on 28<sup>th</sup> October 1919.

In 1927 Stanley married Amy Irene Botterill and moved to Canberra where he was employed as a Ranger. On 23<sup>rd</sup> June 1941 he enlisted, service number N277996, and was posted to the 13<sup>th</sup> Garrison Battalion. On 5<sup>th</sup> Jan 1942 he was appointed Acting Corporal and on 24<sup>th</sup> June 1942 was hospitalised on Bribie Island with rheumatoid Arthritis and was discharged on 11<sup>th</sup> May 1943.

After the war he returned to his home in Eyre St, Griffith and died on 1st August 1972.
