Edward was born in Sydney in 1892, the son of John Connelly and Ellen Connelly, nee Donnelon.

He joined F Company, AN&MEF on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 stating that he was a drover, giving his mother at 18 Park St, Rozelle as his next of kin. He returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 18<sup>th</sup> Jan 1915 having completed 161 days service.

On 22<sup>nd</sup> October 1915 Edward joined the AIF as part of the 15<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements for the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, regimental number 4754, and left Sydney for Egypt aboard the STAR OF ENGLAND on 8<sup>th</sup> March. On 20<sup>th</sup> April 1916 he was taken on strength by the 53<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, shortly after the battalion moved to France where he was appointed a Lance Corporal on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1916.

Edward spend some time away from action in July 1916 suffering from shell shock before he was transferred back to the UK on 10<sup>th</sup> October with a Hernia and admitted to the Military Hospital at Herne Bay, Kent. On 4<sup>th</sup> May 1917 he was returned to Australia aboard the RUNIC for "Home Service".

He arrived back in Melbourne on 5<sup>th</sup> July 1917, travelled overland to Sydney where he was discharged, medically unfit, on 21<sup>st</sup> August.

On 15<sup>th</sup> Feb 1919 he married Mary Jane Amelia Snedden and died in Sydney on 5<sup>th</sup> July 1948.
