Peter was born in Bairnsdale, Victoria in 1889, the son of Allan Symonds and Martha (nee Tomlin) Anderson.

He enlisted into G Company, AN&MEF on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 stating that he was a tram conductor and single. He gave his mother, Mrs O Love, of 67 Charles St, Richmond, Vic as his next of kin, his father having died in 1909 and his mother having remarried.

Peter returned from Rabaul and was discharged, time expired, on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1915 having served 206 days.

On 11<sup>th</sup> May 1915, Peter joined the AIF, Regimental Number 6607, and was assigned to HQ, 2<sup>nd</sup> Division and worked at the Field Hospital, Liverpool. He was transferred to the 8<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance and left Australia aboard the ASCANIUS on 10<sup>th</sup> November 1915 for Suez. With the withdrawal of Australian troops from Gallipoli, Peter moved with his unit to France in June 1916.

On 30<sup>th</sup> October 1917 he was transferred back to HQ, 2<sup>nd</sup> Division before moving to the 13<sup>th</sup> Field Ambulance on 7<sup>th</sup> November 1918, a few days before the cessation of hostilities.

On 27<sup>th</sup> April 1919 he boarded the RUNIC for return to Australia as part of the Nursing staff, arriving back home on 11<sup>th</sup> June.

Peter was discharged on 4<sup>th</sup> August 1919.

On 24<sup>th</sup> July 1920 he married Nelly May Dayton and died in 1966. He is buried at Burwood.
