Arthur was born in Ormskirk, Lancashire, England on 17<sup>th</sup> July 1896. On 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 he enlisted in B Company, AN&MEF, stating that he was single, a "motor engineer" by trade and gave a Edith Lewis of 11 Halsby Rd, Aintree, Liverpool, UK as his next of kin.

Arthur returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1915 having completed 206 days service.

On 13<sup>th</sup> September 1916 he enlisted in Melbourne in the Army Service Corps, 1<sup>st</sup> Divisional Supply Column as a driver, regimental number 12996. On his enlistment he gave a friend, a Miss Lillian Blanche Jacob of 97 Leicester St, Fitzroy as his next of kin. (Arthur went on to marry Lillian in 1921).

Arthur left Melbourne on 25<sup>th</sup> October 1916 aboard the ULYSSES, landing in Plymouth on 28<sup>th</sup> December. On 27<sup>th</sup> Feb 1917 he was charged with conduct to the prejudice of good order and military discipline and sentence to 28 days detention. He was further charge by court martial on 7<sup>th</sup> July 1917 with the theft od f a bicycle and sentenced to 6 months detention and again on 5<sup>th</sup> Jan 1918 he received 28 days field punishment.

He finally arrived in France on 2<sup>nd</sup> Feb 1918 and was evacuated back to England on 1<sup>st</sup> June suffering from Pyrexia. He returned to Melbourne aboard the GAIKA, leaving England on 8<sup>th</sup> November 1918, arriving on 29<sup>th</sup> December and then was discharged s medically unfit on 23<sup>rd</sup> February 1919.

Arthur enlisted again on 7<sup>th</sup> October 1939, service number V83845 and served with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Motor Training Regiment as a motor driver, being discharged as medically unfit on 7<sup>th</sup> July 1942.

Arthur died in 1962.
