Archibald enlisted into E Company, AN&MEF on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 and stated that he was born in Stirling, Stirlingshire, Scotland, was 29 years old, a labourer and single. He gave his mother, Mrs Jean Anderson, 15 Grosvenor St, Edinburgh, as his next of kin. He also stated that he had previous military service with the Edinburgh Royal Volunteer Artillery Garrison.

Archibald returned from Rabaul and was discharged, termination of engagement, on 18<sup>th</sup> Jan 1915, having served 161 days.

On 8<sup>th</sup> March 1915 he enlisted in the 18<sup>th</sup> Battalion, A Company, regimental number 73. He left Australia aboard the CERAMIC on 25<sup>th</sup> June 1915, finally arriving on the Gallipoli Peninsular on 16<sup>th</sup> August 1915. Shortly after arriving, on 27<sup>th</sup> August he received a gunshot wound to the knee and was evacuated, ending up in King George Hospital, England, rejoining his unit just prior to the unit leaving the Middle East on 18<sup>th</sup> March 1916 for France.

On 27<sup>th</sup> July 1916, Archibald was killed at Pozieres, France. He is remembered at the Australian War Memorial at Villers Bretonneux and on Panel 84 at the Australian War Memorial, Canberra.
