Herbert enlisted in the AN&MEF on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914. He stated that he was born in Kensington, England, was 33 years of age, a station overseer and single. He gave his brother, A Edward Collins, Sun Life, London, as his next of kin. He served as a Lieutenant in the Boer War as part of the South African Irregular Forces and as Adjutant with Robert's Horse.

He was promoted to sergeant on 120<sup>th</sup> October 1914 and then appointed 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant on 20<sup>th</sup> November and placed as Officer in Charge of Native Police on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 1915 after being promoted Lieutenant. He remained in Rabaul after the AN&MEF returned to Australia eventually returning in July 1915.

He was given a commission as Lt in the 30<sup>th</sup> battalion on 30<sup>th</sup> August, remaining in Australia until this was reminted on 1<sup>st</sup> December 1915.
