Sydney was born in Exeter, Derbyshire, England in September 1877. In 1895, when he was 22, he migrated to Canada, where he was a police sergeant. In 1909, he is shown as living in Alberta with his wife, Jessie and three children.

On 11<sup>th</sup> August he enlisted in the AN&MEF, stating that he was a policeman and naming his wife, in Canada, as his next of kin. On 27<sup>th</sup> August he was appointed Lance Corporal and on 11<sup>th</sup> Feb 1915 ne was re-attested on transfer to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion AN&MEF. He was promoted sergeant on 27<sup>th</sup> August 1915 whist posted as police master, Herbertshohe.

He was discharged in Rabaul on 4<sup>th</sup> Jan 1916 and then re-enlisted on 1<sup>st</sup> December 1916, regimental number 583. At this time his wife had joined him in Kokopo. On 18<sup>th</sup> April 1918 he was appointed police master at Namatanai, New Ireland. At some time in 1919/20, his wife, Jessie, returned to Canada for a family visit. Whilst she was away, Sydney resigned on 31<sup>st</sup> July 1920 and died shortly after on 12<sup>th</sup> December 1920 whilst his wife was returning from Canada on the SONOMA, via Melbourne. She was advised of his death on her arrival in Melbourne.
