William was born in Christchurch, New Zealand in 1880, the son of George Henry Carr and Sarah Elizabeth Carr, nee Downham. He served with the 9<sup>th</sup> New Zealand Voluntary Contingent in the South African (Boer) War. The details are a little sketchy. It would appear he stowed away of a ship ex Sydney that was taking the 7<sup>th</sup> New Zealand Contingent, arriving in South Africa and joining up on 14<sup>th</sup> Feb 1902 with the service number SA6341. What can be confirmed is that he transferred to the 9<sup>th</sup> Contingent on 12<sup>th</sup> March 1902 and given the number SA7857. On the way back from South Africa he developed pneumonia and was discharged, medically unfit, on 8<sup>th</sup> September 1902 after a month's sick leave.

In 1908 he married Mary Helena Roth and on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 he joined D Company, AN&MEF stating that he was a labourer and gave his wife, at Madras St, North City, Christchurch as his next of kin. He had a newborn son, William Laurence, at the time of signing up. He returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1915, having completed 206 days service.

William was listed on the NZ WW! Reserve Rolls.

On 24<sup>th</sup> Nov 1943 William's son, William Laurence, who was a Flight Sergeant in the RNZAF was killed over Italy.

William died on 30<sup>th</sup> June 1950 and is buried at Macquarie Park Cemetery.
