Victor was born in Darlinghurst, New South Wales in 1887 the son of David Charles and Caroline (nee Moore) Ainsworth. He joined the AN&MEF (G Company) on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 and on his attestation papers he stated that he was a boot salesman, single and that his mother at 324 Oxford St, Paddington, was his next of kin.

On 4<sup>th</sup> March 1915 he returned from Rabaul and was discharged, time expired, having completed 206 days service.

On 27<sup>th</sup> March 1915 he enlisted in the 20<sup>th</sup> Battalion, A Company, and left Australia aboard the Berrima with the battalion on 26<sup>th</sup> June 1915 for Suez. With the battalion, he landed on ANZAC Cove on 27<sup>th</sup> August 1915 and remained there until the battalion was withdrawn on 31<sup>st</sup> December 1915.

With the battalion he left Alexandria on 18<sup>th</sup> March 1916, arriving at Marseilles on the 25<sup>th</sup>. On 24<sup>th</sup> Jan 1917 he was transferred to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Division Salvage Company. On 7<sup>th</sup> July 1917 he was appointed Lance Corporal and was promoted ER Corporal on 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1919. ER means Extra Regimental, meaning that Victor was appointed a corporal within the regiment although there was no vacancy at that time.

On 21<sup>st</sup> March 1919, at Devonport, Victor embarked aboard the KILDONIAN CASTLE for Australia, arriving in Sydney on 10<sup>th</sup> May. He was discharged from the AIF on 19<sup>th</sup> October 1920.

On 29<sup>th</sup> Sept 1928, at Rochdale, New South Wales, Victor married Elsie Martha Gibbons. He died at Belmore on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 1955 and is buried at the Woronora Memorial Park Cemetery.
