

Thomas was born in Llandyssul, Wales on 12 May 1889, the son of Griffith Davies, a corn merchant, and his wife Catherine. On 12th August 1914 he joined the Army Medical Corps, AN&MEF, stating that he was a salesman and single, giving his father at Albion House, Llandyssul, as his next of kin.

Thomas returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 7th April 1915 having completed 239 days service.

On 13th July 1915 he joined the AIF and attended the No.6 Offices School, Moore Park and on completion of the course was appointed a 2 Lt as part of the 4th Reinforcements, 31st Battalion. On 14th March he embarked on the ANCHISES, arriving in Suez on 13th April. He then moved to France where he joined the 31st on 22nd July 1916. On 6th October he was gassed and evacuated on the HS PANAMA to England and admitted to the London General Hospital. He left the UK on 17th March 1917 aboard the BELTANA and his appointment was terminated on 14th October 1917.

On 23rd August 1918 he was re-appointed as a Lieutenant with the 18th General Reinforcements and left for the UK on the BAKARA, departing Sydney on 4th September and disembarking in London on 4th November. He transferred to the 5th Training Battalion. He departed Liverpool aboard the CZAR on 23rd March 1919, changing to the DONGOLA at Suez on 10th April.

On 4th June 1919 he married Bertha Donaldson at Mosman and on 13th May 1940 joined enlisted as a Captain, service number N60276, at the NSW Recruitment Centre, where he served until discharged on 31st March 1944.

Thomas died at Balmain on 1st October 1961.
