George was born in Petersham, NSW in 1888, the son of Samuel Butterworth and Mary Hannah Butterworth, nee Horricks.

George enlisted in C Company, AN&MEF on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 stating that he was a Photo Process Engraver, single and gave his father at 3 Abergeldie St, Petersham as his next of kin. He returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1915, having completed 206 days service.

On 12<sup>th</sup> April 1915 he joined the AIF as part of the 1<sup>st</sup> Reinforcements for the 18<sup>th</sup> Battalion, regimental number 1612, as a cook. He left Sydney on the THEMISTOCLES on 12<sup>th</sup> May, subsequently joining the 18<sup>th</sup> on Gallipoli. He returned to Alexandria, following the withdrawal, on 9<sup>th</sup> Jan 1916 and then went to Marseilles with the battalion in March.

George was Mentioned in Dispatches (MID) dated 7<sup>th</sup> September 1917 – "AS Company Cook, who has particularly distinguished himself over a long period, for the high standard of his work and his unselfish devotion to duty."

After the war George gained Photo Engraving employment with the London County Council Schools from 18<sup>th</sup> Feb 1919 till 18<sup>th</sup> May. On 23<sup>rd</sup> Sept 1919 he left England aboard the ASCAUIUS, arriving back in Sydney on 19<sup>th</sup> November and discharged from the AIF on 9<sup>th</sup> Jan 1920.

On 8<sup>th</sup> August 1928 he married Henrietta Klara Moore at Surry Hills and died on 8<sup>th</sup> April 1957.
