William enlisted into H Company, AN&MEF on 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914. He stated that he was 24 years old, born in Cape Town, South Africa, was a seaman and single, giving his sister, Miss Esta Barrington, 24 Victoria Road, Cape Town as his next of kin.

On 5<sup>th</sup> November 1914, William was sentence by a General Court Martial to 6 months with hard labour and to be discharged "with ignominy". He returned to Australia as a military prisoner aboard the MATUNGA, having served 79 days in the AN&MEF.

On 20<sup>th</sup> April 1915, he enlisted in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 6<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements, under the name George Barrington. At this time, he stated he was 32 years of age and gave his brother in law, a Mr J Beal, of 127 Alexandria St, North Fitzroy, as his next of kin.

He departed Australia on 9<sup>th</sup> August 1915 aboard the RUNIC and moved to the Gallipoli Peninsular on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 1915. Shortly after he arrived in France in 1916, he was hospitalised with Shell Shock and eventually returned to Australia aboard the BELTANA, arriving on 15<sup>th</sup> May 1917 and subsequently discharged, medically unfit, on 10<sup>th</sup> August 1917.

William died in South Australia on 22<sup>nd</sup> October 1949.
