Roy was born in Bega, New South Wales, the son of Henry Augustus and Annie (nee Collins) Arnold on 25<sup>th</sup> May 1895.

On 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 he enlisted into C Company of the AN&MEF. On his attestation papers he stated that he was single, a hatter by trade and gave his mother at 33 Comber St, Paddington as his next of kin.

Roy returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired on 4<sup>th</sup> March 1915 after serving 206 days.

Two days after his return he enlisted in the 18<sup>th</sup> Battalion, AIF (regimental number 805) and left Sydney for the Middle East on the CERAMIC, departing Sydney on 25<sup>th</sup> June 1915. On 28<sup>th</sup> August 1915, whilst on Gallipoli he was promoted Corporal and was appointed Lance Sergeant on 5<sup>th</sup> June 1916, whilst the Battalion was in Egypt making ready for their transfer to France.

Whilst in France, on 5<sup>th</sup> August 1916, Roy received a gunshot wound to his hand, which necessitated his evacuation to Hospital in the UK where he recovered, rejoining his Battalion in France on 9<sup>th</sup> October the same year.

On 19<sup>th</sup> May 1918 he was in action at Morlancourt, for which he received the Military Medal. The recommendation for this award states: -

"This N.C.O. did very gallant and useful work during the advance and consolidation of the captured position on the 19<sup>th</sup> inst. near MORLANCOURT. On reaching the objective he at once pushed forward with a captured Machine gun to enfilade a party of the enemy who were still giving trouble from pot-holes in the rear and thus causing them to retire."

The day after this action Roy was promoted to Sergeant and on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 1919, he left the UK to return to Australia aboard the BERRIMA, the very ship he was on when he originally left Australia in 1914.

In 1924 he married Linda Gertrude Mocatta and they had a daughter, Barbara Joan, born 20<sup>th</sup> March 1926. In 1929, Roy enrolled in a Dentistry Degree course at Sydney University, graduating with a Bachelor in Dentistry Science in 1932. He was in private practice until he joined the Division of Dentistry Services in the NSW Department of Health on 4<sup>th</sup> April 1938.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> June 1940, Roy was appointed a Captain in the Australian Army Medical Corps (Dental) and was discharged on 12<sup>th</sup> July 1944 on compassionate grounds following the death of his wife, Linda.

After the war, Roy continued with the Department of Health. In 1954 he married Olive Winnifred Steele and he died on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 1958 at Hunter's Hill, New South Wales.
