

Edwin was born in Dublin, Ireland on 17th March 1883, the son of John N Dundas and his wife Elizabeth Rose, nee Hardy. On 11th August 1914 he enlisted in E Company, AN&MEF under the name Edward Dundas, stating that he was a steward and single, giving his brother Francis at Marrickville as his next of kin. He returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 18th Jan 1915 having completed 161 days service.

On 8th Feb 1915 he enlisted in the AIF as part of the 18th Battalion. He faced a Medical Board on 19th October who recommended he spend 2 months at Blackheath Convalescence Depot to recover from Malaria. He was discharged on 24th December as medically unfit.

On 27th May 1918 he again enlisted, this time in the 10th General Service Reinforcements and embarked aboard the BORDA on 17th July, disembarking at London on 27th September 1918. He was allocated to the 13th Battalion on arrival and then transferred to the 34th Battalion on 17th October. On 19th Jan 1919 he was attached to AIF HQ and promoted sergeant (ER). Due to the timing of his arrival he never made it to France.

On 25th September 1919 he embarked on the PORT DENISON and disembarked in Sydney on 17th November 1919. He was discharged, end of period of engagement, on 2nd Jan 1920.

In 1922 he married Lillian Mary Lunney.

Lillian died on 12th August 1950 and Edwin died at Concord in 1970.
