Edward was born at Mogo in 1893, the son of Terrence and Maggie Brodigan. On 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 he enlisted in the AN&MEF, stating that he was single, an Iron Workers Assistant, and gave his mother at 10 Punt St, Balmain as his next of kin.

Edward returned from Rabaul and was discharged, term expired, on 18<sup>th</sup> Jan 1915, having served 181 days.

On 8<sup>th</sup> August 1915 he signed up as part of the 6<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements of the 19<sup>th</sup> battalion, regimental number 2744, and left Sydney for the Middle East on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 1916 aboard the EURIPIDES. On 5<sup>th</sup> Feb 1916 he was taken on strength and sailed with the battalion from Alexandria to Marseilles on 18<sup>th</sup> March, arriving on 25<sup>th</sup> March.

Between 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> August he attended the Trench Mortar School in France and transferred to the 5<sup>th</sup> Trench Mortar Battery where on 10<sup>th</sup> April 1917 he was appointed Lance Corporal and then promoted Corporal on 29<sup>th</sup> September. On 17<sup>th</sup> August 1918 he was slightly wounded but remained on duty and returned to Australia aboard the TRASCOS MONTES, arriving in Sydney on 25<sup>th</sup> May 1919. He was discharged from the AIF on 18<sup>th</sup> July 1919.

In 1921 he married Eileen May Mcintosh at Drummoyne. Eileen died in 1957 and Edward on 9<sup>th</sup> July 1985 and he is buried at French's Forest Cemetery.
