Herbert was born in Newtown, NSW, on 2<sup>nd</sup> August 1894, the son of George Burrington and Gertrude Burrington, nee Dunn.

On 11<sup>th</sup> August 1914 he joined C Company, AN&MEF stating that he was a clerk (a storeman at the NSW Government Stores Department), was single and gave his mother at 9 Bay Street, Rockdale as his next of kin. At the time of his enlistment he was a Sergeant with the 38<sup>th</sup> Infantry Battalion (Militia).

On 10<sup>th</sup> September 1915 he joined the 13<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, regimental number 4338, and left Sydney aboard the AENEAS on 20<sup>th</sup> December 1915.

On 14<sup>th</sup> Jan 1916 he was taken on strength with the battalion in Egypt and they sailed from Alexandria for Marseilles on 22<sup>nd</sup> March.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1918 he was appointed Lance Corporal and made Temporary Corporal on 13<sup>th</sup> March 1919. Herbert returned to Australia aboard the DEVON, leaving the UK on 8<sup>th</sup> October 1919 and arriving in Sydney on 27<sup>th</sup> November where he was discharged on 11<sup>th</sup> Feb 1920.

On 22<sup>nd</sup> April 1921 he married Mary Amelia Ita Searle and rejoined the Army on 31<sup>st</sup> March 1943 as a Lieutenant in the 9<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Volunteer Defence Corps, service number N239975. He was discharged on 11<sup>th</sup> September 1945.

Herbert died on 1<sup>st</sup> Feb 1956 and is interred at Woronora Memorial Park.
